

“I was born and raised in Nome and my parents are the late John and Magdeline Alvanna, from King Island. My father died from cancer before I was born, so my mother re-married to Paul Omiak from Little Diomedes when I was three years old. My maternal grandmother, Margaret Sukshaq Nigiruaq helped raised me. I graduated from Nome-Beltz High School.”

Yaayuk earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Inupiaq language, with a minor in Elementary Education at the University of Alaska, Fairbanks. She began her education career with Nome Public Schools as an Inupiaq language and culture teacher then taught English as a Second Language. She then moved on to teaching upper elementary classes. For two years she worked as a Inupiaq region Lead Teacher for the Alaska Rural System Initiative. She worked as the Alaska Native Education Coordinator for a year and a half. She is fluent and literate in the Inupiaq language as well as English. She graduated with a Master’s of Education degree in Language and Literacy.

Raised in the King Island community on the east end of Nome, Yaayuk has a strong Native cultural foundation. While in the classroom, she was a creative and energetic teacher. Being helpful, she worked synergistically with others, and was a project-oriented
